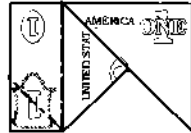


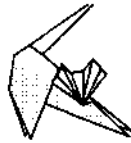
Mountain fold and valley fold.



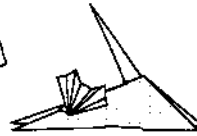
For the bill, mountain-fold extra paper & wrap. (Not for 2 x 1 paper.)

Valley-fold the indicated creases on each of the 4 triangles.

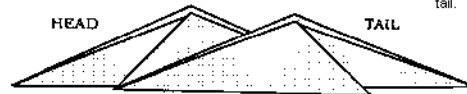
Notes: The drawings here will make a cat that faces left. If you want a right-facing cat, fold the diagrams as mirror images. In the non-paired models, the head helps to hold the shape. The thickness of the paper leg where the 2 fish bases are joined.



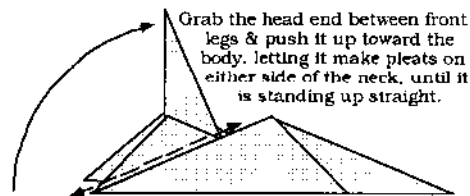

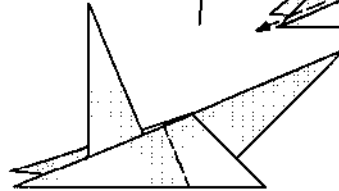
With the dollar bill, be sure that the extra paper is inside the tail.



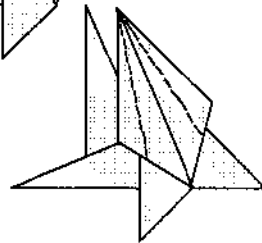
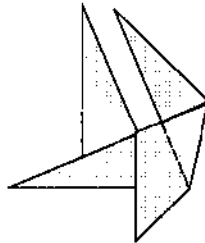
2 fishbases: rabbit-ear along the existing creases.



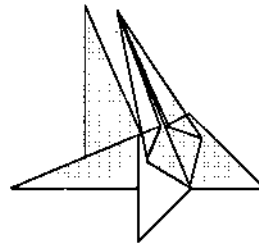
Narrow the front legs on either side. Sink that triangle. From the top, open the triangle area. Start to push down, then form the under-side open up the triangle to continue the mountain-fold.



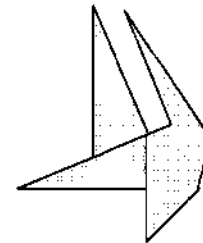
Grasp tail, lift & push it up between back legs to form pleats. Align tail to continue the line of the back. Swing back legs down at the existing hip pleats. Inside-reverse fold tail.

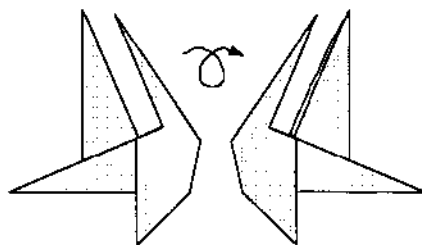


Spread the tail open & skinny it from the tip. You can blunt the end if you like.



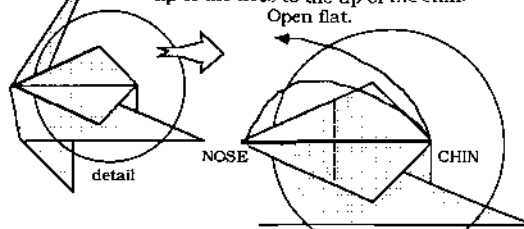
Close the tail.





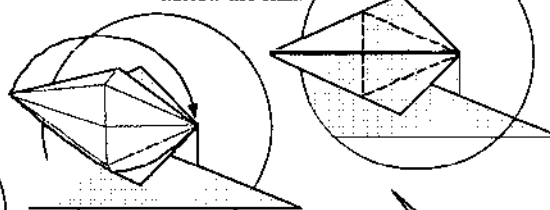
Turn the model over. While the head can actually be folded to face either direction, folding as described will make the head secure the thick layers of the leg where the 2 fish bases are joined.

Open the head between the layers at the back of the head & squash it flat. Fold the tip of the nose to the tip of the chin.

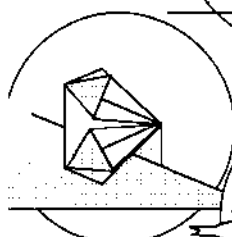
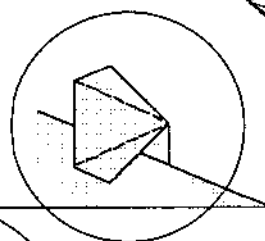


Open flat.

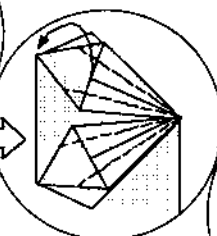
Pre-crease to narrow the chin.



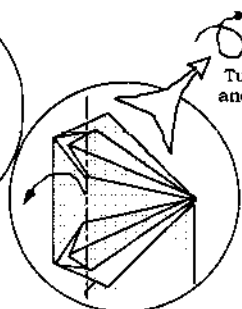
Make a modified petal fold by opening the chin & bringing the tip of the nose to lie on top of the tip of the chin.



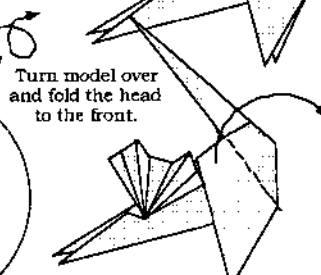
Squash-fold the flaps on either side of the face.



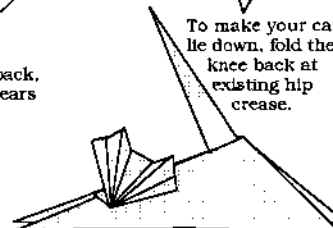
Pre-crease to narrow the flaps, then bring the center of the small triangle up. This move is similar to making the frog base.



Fold the top of the head back, leaving the little pointed ears sticking up.



Turn model over and fold the head to the front.



To make your cat lie down, fold the knee back at existing hip crease.
